



## A guide to SATs Results - Year 2

**Key Stage 1 SATs** take place in Year 2 throughout May. Since 2016, more challenging SATs tests reflect the new curriculum at the end of the Key Stages. In Key Stage 1, end of year judgements are made mainly through teacher assessments.

Subject	Test
English	Reading, 2 papers Writing is through Teacher Assessment
Mathematics	2 papers: Arithmetic and Mathematical Reasoning

Teachers will use the results from the tests, along with the work your child has done throughout the year, to help them to reach their own judgements about how your child is progressing at the end of Key Stage 1.

**You will be send a school report showing your child's progress in July and their end of year outcomes.**

### Teachers Assessments



Children will be assessed against the interim framework standards when being taught by their teachers for reading, writing and maths at the end of Key Stage 1. This will see if they've achieved the expected standard.

The indicators are:

- WTS working towards the national standard
- EXS at the expected standard
- GDS working at greater depth within the national standard.

Alongside continuous teacher assessments, there are national assessments at regular intervals in English primary education, including a Phonics Screening Check in Year 1 and SATs in Year 6.
