News from your Headteacher

So, our week has again been very busy with lots of great things going on! On Thursday, we all visited the church for our Harvest Festivals. We have 3 services as we can't all fit in the church at the same time. The children were beautifully behaved-they sang enthusiastically and listened well to the readings from the children and to Reverend Judy's sermon.

Years 4 and 5 have participated in some 'walkability' sessions. Walkability, is a new 'Child Pedestrian Training' (CPT) programme, developed in collaboration with Devon County Council and Vision Zero South West.

This structured programme is tailored to equip children in Years 3-6 with vital pedestrian safety skills, developing confidence and responsibility on their journeys to and from school. The main aim of the CPT course is to provide children with the knowledge, awareness, and practical skills necessary for safer pedestrian practices. It integrates classroom learning with real-world experiences. The CPT program covers a range of essential road safety topics with both a theory and practical session. You may have spotted the children out and about this week putting their new learning into practice – they were lucky with the weather too!

Safeguarding: Contextual Safeguarding

'Contextual Safeguarding' recognises that as children develop they are influenced by a whole range of environments and people outside of the family. It refers to the fact that children and young people can be at risk of harm due to external factors (outside of the home) where parents and carers have little influence over these contexts.

Some children at our school face risks from multiple contexts – this could be playing in the park, belonging to a club, interacting with others online or simple being out and about in the local community.

Our Safeguarding Leads and staff do our best to engage with children – forging positive relationships, and in doing so help to keep them safe by discussing these contextual risks. This way we are able to consider whether any wider environmental factors are present in a child's life that are a threat to their safety or welfare and do our best to work with others to improve these situations.

We were pleased that 96% of our pupils that completed our wellbeing / safeguarding survey felt that they knew a trusted adult in school that they could talk to. For those who replied that they were 'unsure' or with a 'no', we hope that they too will identify trusted adults as they progress through the school and get to know staff better.

We encourage everyone in our school community to keep eyes and ears open for anything potentially concerning regarding our young people; perhaps in local parks or during children's journeys to or from school. This may include the way in which they travel, eg Mrs Jones has shared concerns about bikes and scooters in School Lane, where these can pose a risk to other children and adults.

If you are concerned about a child or young person, including in a contextual safeguarding situation, then you should report this to the school or call the 'Front Door' (formerly known as MASH) on 01345 1551071, or the police (999 or 112) if you consider that a child in at risk of immediate harm.

We appreciate everyone's support in keeping our children safe both in school, within our families and in wider (contextual) situations and environments.


Sports & Achievements
