### **Safeguarding**

At Withycombe Raleigh Primary School we are committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of our children. Our school recognises its moral and statutory responsibility for safeguarding, and takes this very seriously. In fact, we believe that 'safeguarding is MY responsibility' - meaning that it is everyone's individual responsibility to ensure that our children are kept safe.

All of our staff, governors and volunteers receive annual (and ongoing) safeguarding training. Each member of staff knows what to do and who to speak to if they are concerned about a child in our care, whether they are at school, at home or in the wider community. We follow procedures to ensure children are listened to and receive effective support and protection.

Eliza Brooks Hazel class got her 20 metres swimming certificate.


