Safeguarding

At our school, we are committed to creating a safe, caring environment where every child can learn and grow confidently. An important part of this is helping children understand personal boundaries, respect for themselves and others and the difference between appropriate and inappropriate behaviour.

Sometimes, children may show behaviours that are not suitable for their age. When these behaviours relate to body boundaries or personal space, they may be classed as harmful sexualised behaviours. These behaviours are usually a sign that a child needs support, guidance and clear learning.

Our Approach

If and when concerns arise, our staff are trained to follow a calm and child-centred process, with reference to our 3 school rules (Be Ready, Be Respectful and Be Safe)

1. Keeping Everyone Safe

Staff intervene gently and promptly to make sure all children 'feel safe'

2. Teaching and Guided Support

We talk with the children involved in an age-appropriate way, helping them understand personal boundaries, consent and respectful behaviour. We use simple, clear language to support their learning.

3. Working Closely with Families

Parents and carers are involved early, so we can share information, offer guidance and ensure children receive consistent messages at home and school.

4. Extra Help When Needed

We may offer additional wellbeing support or, where appropriate, seek advice from specialist services (including the NSPCC or MASH) to help children develop healthy and safe behaviours.

What We Teach: PANTS, Consent and Our RSE Curriculum

Our teaching is grounded in our Relationships and Sex Education (RSE) curriculum but is also part of our broader teaching and interactions with our children e.g. a classroom 'Circle Time' activity or in an assembly.



The NSPCC PANTS Rule helps children to learn that:

Privates are private

Always remember your body belongs to you

No means no

Talk about secrets that upset you

Speak up, someone can help

Understanding Consent – At primary level, consent is taught in simple terms such as "asking first," "respecting someone's no," and understanding personal space.

Recognising Safe and Unsafe Behaviours – Children learn to identify trusted adults, understand boundaries and know when and how to speak up.

Our messages are repeated consistently and with care.

How Parents and Carers Can Help - You can support this learning at home by:

- Talking openly with your child using the PANTS rule
 - https://www.nspcc.org.uk/advice-for-families/pants-underwear-rule/
- Using the correct names for body parts
- Encouraging your child to say "no" if they feel uncomfortable
- Letting them know they can always talk to you or another trusted adult

By approaching concerns with sensitivity, education and teamwork, we ensure children get the support they need to learn safe, respectful behaviour. If you have any questions or would like more information, please contact us.
