Once everything has been sorted and packed we arrange for the truck to be loaded – This is not an easy task. Our volunteers come after work and as everything has to be carried by hand from the store to the truck, everyone is exhausted by the end of the night. These enormous articulated lorries take a huge amount to fill!



The joy, the excitement, is overwhelming.

Any present is, of course, most welcome but the items that you put in a shoebox do have to be new. It is also important to try and fill the shoebox. We realise that this can be expensive — so we are happy to encourage children or adults, friends and neighbours to get together to fill a small or large box. The children and their families in Moldova — one of the poorest and deprived areas of Europe - live such grim lives and so their appreciation is beyond words. Your gift will reflect that true Christmas spirit where we think of others, at least for once in the year.

To the poor of Moldova, Christmas Shoeboxes are also strong symbols of love and hope - and evidence that people in other parts of the world do care.
