Although children and staff are ready for half term break, everyone has settled into the new routines brilliantly and school feels a very happy and calm place. We have certainly crammed a lot into the past 6 weeks. We've had trips off site, theme days, mufti, a visiting choir, Parents' Evenings and a disco! Thank you to everyone that has made all the 'extra' events possible.

PTFA

I hope your children enjoyed the disco on Friday. The event ran really smoothly due to the fact we had lots of parent and staff volunteers. We raised just over £1,100 which is a fantastic amount. The events run by our PTFA enable us as a school to provide 'extra' things that our school budget just cannot afford. In the past few months the PTFA have agreed to fund: the festive Panto performance for the whole school, our new OPAL storage shed, £200 per class to drive down the cost of school trips, and £1,500 to support the new swimming initiative! Their events like the disco and end of term mufti days enable this to continue.

One of the biggest fundraisers for us is the Christmas Fair - this year this wonderful event will take place on 5th December. If you haven't volunteered before, please consider doing so this time; even if it is only for an hour. We need as many people to help support this event as possible, so please keep the date in your diary!

On Monday we launched our Christmas Shoebox appeal. This year we're working with Christ Church Woodbury and Livi Ju their Children and Families Worker. Peter Abungu, the founder of the charity, spoke to the children about the work they do in Kibera. The children had lots of interesting questions for Peter too!

Hope4Kibera is a charity we've supported for a number of years and we hope to fundraise for them again next year. For those families who are new to our school, I thought it might be helpful to give you a brief overview of the charity.



Hope4Kibera is a UK-registered charity founded in 2019.

It operates in Nairobi, Kenya, specifically in the Kibera area, which is one of the largest urban slums in Africa and lacks basic infrastructure, clean water and sanitation.

The main aim is to provide free secondary education, including boarding, to motivated students from very poor families in Kibera who cannot afford school fees. The school is called Bright Hope Education Centre.

Safeguarding

Firework Safety

As we enter the firework season with Diwali, Bonfire Night and other celebrations fast approaching, it's important to take a moment to reflect on the importance of firework safety, especially when children are involved.

While fireworks can be an exciting part of autumn and winter celebrations, they also pose serious risks if not handled correctly. At Withycombe, the safety and wellbeing of our pupils is always our top priority. With this in mind, we ask all families to be vigilant and responsible when using fireworks at home or attending displays.



Safeguarding Children Around Fireworks

Children are naturally curious and excited by fireworks, but they should never be allowed to handle or light them. All fireworks and sparklers should be managed strictly by adults, with clear boundaries and supervision in place. We also advise families to attend publicly organised displays if possible, where safety precautions are more likely to be properly enforced.

The Firework Code

To help keep everyone safe, please follow the official Firework Code:

- 1. Only buy fireworks that are CE marked these meet UK safety standards.
- 2. Keep fireworks in a closed box and use them one at a time.
- **3.** Read and follow all instructions carefully.
- 4. Light fireworks at arm's length with a taper, and stand well back.
- 5. Never return to a firework once it has been lit, even if it fails to go off.
- 6. Never throw fireworks or put them in your pocket.
- 7. Keep pets indoors and ensure children are a safe distance away.
- 8. Sparklers are not toys never give them to children under 5, and always supervise their use.
- 9. Have a bucket of water, sand or a hose nearby for emergencies and used sparklers (which remain incredibly hot after use).
- 10. Respect your neighbours, especially those with small children, pets, or those sensitive to noise.

The more we weigh the more we pay! Extra bags are welcome - there is no limit

















