News from your Headteacher

Common Illnesses



We're at that point in the year where everyone seems to be struggling with some kind of illness or other - we wish everyone who is poorly at the moment a speedy recovery! Almost all babies, toddlers and children are likely, at some point, get the most common childhood illnesses like chickenpox, colds, sore throats and ear infections.

When children are ill, parents often struggle to know if their child is well enough to attend school. The poster we've included on the next page provides guidance to help you decide if your child is well enough for school or not.

You can also use the HANDi paediatric app. Developed by NHS organisations in Devon, the HANDI Paediatric app is available to download for free to your device, and is a great way to get expert advice. It has been developed by paediatric consultants and will give you access to GP and clinical guidelines for the most common childhood health care concerns. Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over	
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode	
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.	
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics	
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared	
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started	
Scabies	they've had their first treatment	
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics	
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

Communication

As we continue to work in partnership to support every child, we would like to kindly remind families about the importance of maintaining a polite and respectful tone when communicating with school staff.

Our staff team is committed to responding to messages within our working hours of 8:00am – 4:00pm, Monday to Friday and we will always aim to reply within 48 hours. While we understand that concerns can sometimes feel urgent, sending emails late at night or expecting immediate replies can put pressure on staff outside their working day. Please consider the timing of your emails or using schedule send.

We also recognise that parent WhatsApp groups can be a helpful way to share reminders, organise lifts to events, or clarify simple details. However, we respectfully ask that these forums are not used to air concerns or frustrations about the school or individual families / children. Doing so can unintentionally spread misinformation and create worry among families – in some cases sharing personal or incorrect information can present a safeguarding risk.

If you do have a question or concern, please come and speak to us directly or contact the office so we can support you as quickly and effectively as possible. We value open communication and are always happy to listen or arrange a meeting to discuss a concern.

Safeguarding: Supporting our Families and Marking White Ribbon Day

Supporting Families Through Difficult Times

At Withycombe, the wellbeing of every child and family is at the heart of what we do. We know that some families may experience challenging situations at home, including violence and abuse. Although this can be a very difficult topic to talk about, we want to reassure our community that if you are experiencing difficult times, you're not alone and there is support available.

Domestic abuse can affect anyone, and its impact on children and families can be long-lasting. Our role as a school is to provide a safe, nurturing and understanding environment where children can feel secure, and where families can access help safely and without judgement.

Support can be accessed in the following ways:

- Our Safeguarding team (Mr Smith, Mrs Jones and Mrs Wheeler) are available to listen, and to help signpost families to the right services.
- We provide a safe space where children can talk to a trusted adult if they are feeling worried.
- Adults are also able to access a safe office space at school to seek advice on next steps, and to make private phone calls e.g. to domestic abuse support services, early help, and counselling providers.
- Our staff are trained to recognise signs of distress in children and understand what to do and who to contact when domestic abuse is disclosed we always respond in a calm, supportive way.
- We can also support practically, such as providing assistance with attendance, routines, wellbeing referrals, and access to breakfast club or after school provision.


