

Safeguarding:

Road Safety Week - Stop, Look, Listen and Think!

This coming week, our children will mark Road Safety Week by taking some time to learn about how we can all stay safe on and around roads.

We will be reminding everyone about the Green Cross Code – that classic piece of wisdom we all grew up with: **Stop. Look. Listen. Think!** - four simple steps that can make all the difference, whether you are walking to school or scooting home at the end of a damp or dimpsey day.

How Parents and Carers Can Help

Your example makes the biggest impact! Here are a few ways you can support Road Safety Week at home:

- ✓ Model how to cross a road safely show children how to wait, look both ways and cross only when it's safe.
- ✓ Park responsibly please also keep our school entrances clear for everyone's safety we know it's hard to find a safe place to drop off near the school, so please leave more time and park a little further away.
- ✓ Be visible encourage children to wear bright or reflective clothing, especially on dark mornings or evenings. (You can buy cheap reflective arm bands / patches on line.)
- ✓ Put phones away both adults and children should stay alert near roads. (18% of secondary school children have been hit or had a dangerous near miss due to this distraction!)
- ✓ Talk about it discuss why road safety matters during walks or drives; even a quick chat can reinforce safe habits.

We've also recently taken part in 'Walkability' to teach children more about road safety, but it's always good to work together to make sure everyone knows how to Stop, Look, Listen and Think.

Please also let us know if you would consider fulfilling an important *heroic* role in our school community! Devon County Council has the funding in place for a crossing patrol officer outside our school, but despite our combined efforts they have been unable to recruit. This is a rewarding role where you build relationships with local families over time, while keeping the children safe.
